

HISTORICAL LOCATIONS

JOHN J. ALBRIGHT H
Famous in Buffalo's commercial development and donor of the magnificent Albright Art Gallery.

FRANK B. BAIRD 31
Great leader of Niagara Frontier in Iron and many other industries, a civic leader and father of the Peace Bridge spanning the Niagara River.

PHILIP BECKER 12
One of Buffalo's greatest Mayors as well as a distinguished mercantile and civic leader.

LAWRENCE D. BELL 35
Aviation pioneer and founder of the Bell Aircraft Corporation.

LOUISE BETHUNE 10
First professional American woman architect. Designed the Lafayette Hotel as well as many schools and other public, industrial, and commercial buildings.

BRIG-GEN DANIEL D. BIDWELL Island at F, L, P
Monument to greatest hero of the Civil War from this area. Killed in Battle of Cedar Creek, VA, 10/19/1864. Buried in family lot on Section H.

BIRGE MEMORIAL 23
George K. Birge, long identified with Buffalo industrial progress, nationally known manufacturer of wallpaper, a leader in automobile industry. A beautiful replica of Greek architecture, rich in stately columns.

BLOCHER MEMORIAL 11
Life-like figures under glass makes this one of the most unusual and celebrated memorials in the country, with thousands of coast-to-coast visitors annually.

BLUE-SKY MAUSOLEUM 15
Originally designed in 1928 by Frank Lloyd Wright for Darwin D. Martin and constructed by Forest Lawn in 2004. For more information call office or visit www.blueskymausoleum.com

WILLIAM I. BUCHANAN H
Director of the beautiful Pan American Exposition held in Buffalo 1901.

CAPTAIN THOMAS A. BUDD H
Killed in Civil War engagement March 1862 while commanding U.S.S. Penguin at Mosquito Inlet on the west coast of Florida.

BATTLE OF BUNKER HILL MONUMENT G
Cenotaph to Spaulding relatives who fought in Revolutionary War. Example of the role of rural cemetery in elevating and strengthening patriotism in late 19th century.

WILLIS HAVILAND CARRIER 15
"Father of the Air Conditioning Industry." Designed first scientific air conditioning system while an engineer at Buffalo Forge Company and later established the Carrier Corporation.

SHIRLEY CHISHOLM BIRCHWOOD
First African-American woman elected to congress.

STEPHEN M. CLEMENT 4
Outstanding Buffalo Banker, President of the Marine Bank 1869-1892, now the HSBC Bank USA.

FREDERICK A. COOK, M.D. CHAPEL
Polar explorer and first claimant to the discovery of the North Pole.

CRANE MEMORIAL D
Gothic Revival red sandstone monument of Thomas and Amanda Crane, 1853, designed by Richard Upjohn, architect of St. Paul's Cathedral.

DEDICATORY MARKER 25
A marker of the special dedicatory exercises of FOREST LAWN, Nov. 21, 1864.

DEERFOOT 12
Set world records for 5 and 10 miles and hour-long run, with greatest fame and success won in England.

ELK'S BURIAL PLOT 18
Devoted to the members of the Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks.

FAKIR OF AVA 7
A prestidigitator and famous slight of hand entertainer whose protege was Kellar, who became one of the world's most renowned illusionists.

WILLIAM G. FARGO AA
Organizer with Henry Wells of the first transcontinental Express Service, conducted by these men thereafter as the Wells Fargo Express.

MILLARD FILLMORE MEMORIAL F
Thirteenth President of the United States (1850-1853).

FRANKLIN SQUARE MONUMENT N
Moved here in 1851 from the Franklin Square Cemetery where County Court now stands. Dedicated to this first Buffalo cemetery and to the Soldiers of the War of 1812 and Farmer's Brother, a Seneca Indian Chief.

BERLIN LOT 9
Grave of Dorothy Berlin, first wife of Irving Berlin.

GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC 14
A memorial Shrine for men of the Grand Army of the Republic who fought with the Union Forces in the War of the Rebellion (1861-1865).

ERASTUS GRANGER J
One of the founders of Buffalo who, as agent of the U.S. Government, settled many affairs between white men and Indians. The first land purchased for Forest Lawn was part of his farm.

ANNA KATHARINE GREEN ROHLFS 27
Author of 35 novels, ranked as one of the premier writers of the 19th century detective fiction. Her first book, *The Leavenworth Case* (1878), initially sold more than 500,000 copies.

C. J. HAMLIN 1
Pioneer among Buffalo merchants. He founded the establishment from which the William Hengeler Company emerged. Nationally famed for the breeding and training of thoroughbred trotting horses.

SARA HINSON 1
Buffalo school teacher and founder of Flag Day, June 14th.

JOHN FRANK HOOVER 16
Buffalo area Civil War veteran who was awarded a medal for his part in the pursuit and capture of John Wilkes Booth, assassin of President Lincoln. He died on July 21, 1919.

EDWARD H. HUTCHINSON 26
A foremost figure in Buffalo's Industrial and commercial development and a civic leader of unsurpassed zeal, donor of the land on which the Hutchinson High School now stands. President of Forest Lawn 34 years, & member of the Board of Trustees 46 years.

RICK JAMES 10
Grammy Award-winning singer, songwriter and R&B/funk music star.

CAPTAIN JOSEPH T. JONES MAUSOLEUM 3
One of the originators and operators of the Gorge Railway at Niagara Falls and of the Gulf Island Ship Canal and railway between Gulfport, Mississippi and Gulf of Mexico.

JESSE KETCHUM 1
Donor of the Jesse Ketchum Medals awarded to Buffalo boys and girls for high scholastic standing.

EDWARD KLEINHANS 27
Buffalo mercantile leader. He and his wife were donors of beautiful Kleinhans Music Hall.

JOHN LAY, JR. D
The first interment in Forest Lawn Cemetery (July 12, 1850).

LETCHWORTH MAUSOLEUM 7
Unique, private family mausoleum.

WILLIAM PRYOR LETCHWORTH X
At age 25 formed Pratt & Letchworth, hardware manufacturer. Built home, Glen Iris, on land he later deeded to NYS to create Letchworth State Park, Grand Canyon of the East.

"LITTLE GIRL" Mirror Lake
"The little girl on the little island stands in memory of all children."

MARIA M. LOVE F
Philanthropist and social visionary, one of the most prominent adherents to the "Social Gospel," a humanitarian movement during the late 19th century interested in solutions to urban problems, especially poverty.

NORMAN E. MACK 10 1/2
The distinguished newspaper publisher (*Buffalo Times*), who also served for many years as National Chairman of the Democratic Party.

MITCHELL I. MARK MAUSOLEUM FF
Pioneer of the Motion Picture Industry who started the first international chain of movie houses.

MASONIC PLOT 13
Under the administration of Masonic Board of Relief.

GENERAL ALBERT J. MYER MAUSOLEUM X
Founder of the U.S. Weather Bureau. Graduated from Buffalo Medical College. Surgeon in U.S. Army and later elevated to rank of Brigadier General. Head of Army Signal Corps during Civil War.

GENERAL ELY S. PARKER 12
Full-blooded Seneca Indian. Officer in the Union Army. Member of staff of General U.S. Grant, and penned final draft of Lee's surrender terms at Appomattox. Remained in regular army after Civil War, attaining rank of Brigadier General.

PHELPS MONUMENT I
Sculpted in Rome, Italy in 1876 by N. Cantalamessa Papotti, the classically draped figures of Faith, Hope, Charity, and Fortitude with various symbolic objects exemplify the instructive nature of the rural cemetery and Victorian funerary art.

GEORGE N. PIERCE MAUSOLEUM 3
Brought fame to Buffalo as the producer of bicycles and the originator and manufacturer of the famous Pierce Arrow automobile.

SAMUEL F. PRATT MEMORIAL X
One of the greatest developers of Buffalo and its industries whose imposing memorial of great decorative beauty is set off by a group of angels.

MARY JANE RATHBUN 4
Nationally known marine zoologist specializing in Crustaceans for 53 years at the National Museum in Washington, D.C. (Smithsonian Institution).

RED JACKET 12
Great Chieftain of the Seneca Indians. Famed for his oratory and wisdom of council.

VICTOR MOREAU RICE 0
Lawyer, Supt. of Buffalo Schools, first NYS Supt. of Public Instruction, initiated free public education in New York State.

MAJOR GENERAL BENNET RILEY E
Served in Mexican War and as Military Governor of California. One of three generals for whom military posts were named. All three of his sons died young in the service of the U.S.

WILLIAM A. ROGERS MEMORIAL 7
An artistic bronze statue "Aspiration" created by Harriet Whitney Frishmuth, noted sculptress.

JACOB SCHOELLKOPF F
Outstanding Buffalo merchant, founder of widespread successful industries, creator of Niagara Falls power development.

FRANK A. SEDITA 32
Mayor of Buffalo for three terms (1958-1973), serving longer than any previous mayor.

WILLIAM SHELTON E
Beloved rector of St. Paul's Church from 1829-1881. Shelton Square is named in his honor.

C. SIDNEY SHEPARD MAUSOLEUM 5
A building of imposing designs and structure designed by Arthur D. Pickering of N.Y.C.

CLAUDIA MAE SIMS 33
An active community leader, one of the founders of the Juneteenth Festival and B.U.I.L.D., and a member of the Community Action Organization.

SISTERS OF SAINT JOSEPH CEMETERY SSJ
The Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph traces its origins to Le Puy-en-Velay, France, around 1646. The order moved from diocesan to pontifical status in 1957.

ALFRED P. SOUTHWICK 31
Buffalo dentist who invented the electric chair. His invention was first used in Auburn Prison on August 6, 1890.

SPANISH AMERICAN WAR VETERANS 19
Dedicated to the veterans of the Spanish-American War who fought for the freedom of the Spanish-held lands in the Caribbean and Pacific.

ELBRIDGE GERRY SPAULDING G
Banker and financier, as Representative to 31st Congress, introduced Legal Tender Act, saving the Union from financial disaster. Known as "The Father of the Greenback."

MARGARET ST. JOHN 2
A widow with nine children during the War of 1812. Mrs. St. John refused to flee in December, 1813, when British troops began to burn the village of Buffalo. Her home was spared.

MARY BURNETT TALBERT A
Civil rights activist against lynching, patriotic worker during World War I and Red Cross nurse with the American Expeditionary Force in France.

E.R. THOMAS 26
Pioneer manufacturer of Thomas motor cars and sponsor of the trailblazing worldwide auto tour.

TRACY MEMORIAL 3
Sarcophagus designed by Stanford White with cameo-like bas relief profile of Tracy by Augustus Saint-Gaudens.

VOLUNTEER FIREMEN B
Firemen's Benevolent Association Memorial devoted exclusively to early volunteer firemen of Buffalo.

JAMES D. WARREN 9
Publisher and editor of the newspaper, *Buffalo Express*, with J.N. Mathews. Mr. Warren afterward founded the Buffalo Commercial Advertiser, later renamed the Buffalo Commercial.

SAMUEL M. WELCH AA
Commanding officer of the 65th Regiment National Guard of the State of New York and later Brigadier General of the 4th Brigade of the National Guard.

AMERICA PINCKNEY PETER WILLIAMS A
Great granddaughter of Martha Washington. Her husband, buried with her, is Captain William G. Williams of the U.S. Topographical Engineers who was killed September 21, 1846, while leading a charge at the Battle of Monterey, Mexico.
